An enthusiastic group of 15 SMAAUW women attended the American Association of University Women Virginia State Conference held April 12-13, 2024 at the Hilton Garden Inn in Lynchburg, VA. The annual event, hosted this year by the Lynchburg AAUW Branch, was fun, entertaining and educational!

Taking advantage of Lynchburg's many cultural, art, and historical sites, we were offered the choice of three different local attractions Friday afternoon. Some of us took a guided tour of the beautiful and historical Anne Spencer House and Gardens, some took in the art exhibits at the Maier Museum, while a third group took a tour of the beautifully restored and furnished 1815 Federal style mansion called Point of Honor.

After dinner our branch was able to provide conference support as, thanks to Sandy Furick, a committee coordinated and provided charming "swag" bags and arranged a "Friday Night Fun" warm-up activity as attendees arrived. We enjoyed meeting and getting to know members from branches all over Virginia! We had a total of 76 conference attendees from 18 Virginia branches of AAUW! Who knew there were so few among us who are left-handed or who play an instrument!!

The conference ran from 9:30 a.m.- 4:15 p.m. on Saturday, with a delicious buffet-style salad bar luncheon provided on the premises. One of the day's highlights was our brilliant keynote speaker, Dr. Alison Morrison-Shetlar, President of the University of Lynchburg. Her theme was "Courageous Leaders" and it focused on three distinct styles of leadership: leading from in front, from beside, and from behind. She helped us recognize in and among ourselves how these three different, equally important styles of leadership, combined effectively within an organization, will boost and enhance mission success. A second important speaker was Meghan Kissel, AAUW Senior Director of Policy & Membership Advocacy. She was able to share updates on important legislative work our National AAUW Organization is continuing with in areas such as Title IX and the impending ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment when it is published as the 28th Amendment!

An exciting, enlightening time spent with a group of educated, experienced, involved, passionate and empowered women of Virginia. BRANCH BYLAWS CHANGE / NOTICE OF VOTE MAY 18TH

In 2023, AAUW members voted by more than a two-thirds vote to approve amendments to the AAUW Bylaws. We recently completed the revisions to our branch bylaws required by these changes. Changes include revisions to the first seven Articles, representing the AAUW Model Bylaws, changes to our Article XIV, Section 3 (Affiliate Dues) and some needed formatting and punctuation corrections.

Because all of the revisions are either dictated by AAUW or made to conform to AAUW policy, i.e., the change from a fixed membership year to anniversary date renewal billing, no membership vote is required. Our revisions have been approved by the AAUW Virginia Bylaws Chair, and the revised bylaws document is available on the Members Only page of our website https://smithmountain-va.aauw.net/. (If you don't know the password, email margaretkauffman@aol.com.)

Last May, the membership voted to set a new branch dues amount for regular members. **The following motion will be introduced at the May 18th Branch Meeting** to set dues amounts for other membership categories (none of them currently represented) that are listed by AAUW on the Community Hub. In accordance with our branch bylaws, a 2/3 vote of those present, provided that their number represents a quorum, will be required to approve the motion. Please consider the motion in advance of the meeting.

"With the exception of membership categories exempted from branch dues by AAUW, or by our branch membership in accordance with Article XIV, Section 3, Paragraph b of our bylaws, all branch members will pay dues in the same amount as that in effect for regular members. Two membership categories will be exempt from branch dues: honorary (50-Year) life members and undergraduate students."

Terri Clark

Terri Clark received her B.Sc. (1982) and her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (1988) from Auburn University, Alabama. She served in the US Army Veterinary Corps for 11 ¹/₂ years with tours of duty throughout the US. During her years of service in the Army, RADM Clark completed a 4-year residency program in laboratory animal medicine and was boarded as a Diplomate, American College of Laboratory Animal Medicine, in 1996. In July of 2000, RADM Clark transferred to the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps (USPHS CC) and spent most of her time with the Office of Animal Care and Use (OACU), Office of the Director, National Institutes of Health serving in roles supporting animal care and use training, disaster preparedness, and animal welfare oversight. In April 2010 she was selected to be the Director, OACU, where she provided regulatory oversight for the trans-NIH intramural animal care and use program encompassing 21 animal care programs across 7 geographic areas with ~1.5 billion operating budget. In October 2011, she was named the 10th Chief Veterinary Officer for the US Public Health Service and in this role was responsible for providing leadership and coordination of USPHS veterinary professional affairs for the Office of the US Surgeon General and the Department of Health and Human Services. In November 2016 she was promoted to the rank of Rear Admiral, Lower Half, and at this rank provided support and visibility to the US Surgeon General's office and initiatives as an Assistant Surgeon General. Rear Admiral Clark retired in March 2018 and now resides at Smith Mountain Lake, Virginia where she provides professional consultation for a local humane society, is an active member of her church, Trinity Ecumenical Parish, and has taken an interest in glass mosaic art. She has also renewed her love for swimming and sprint triathlons.

Scholarship Committee - Marsha Protinsky, Chairperson

It's that time of year when our branch takes a deep breath and awaits the joyful news of scholarship recipients having been selected. The Scholarship Committee (Janet Byrne, Cindy Connine, Maxine Edwards, Kris Hill, Cherie Lange, Cat Lineberry and Marsha Protinsky) has been working diligently since the launch of the January 3, 2024 posting to colleges and universities in VA announcing four scholarships offered by our branch to women in the tri-county lake area. The committee received 17 applications, 14 of which were viable and met all requirements set forth in our statements of eligibility. After much reading, thinking, conversing (and gnashing of teeth), the committee selected 4 of those 14 candidates as the recipients of our 2024-2025 scholarships. The scoring rubric made it possible for us to feel confident in our decisions as we ultimately used not only averages, but also median and standard deviation scores, to verify our choices. Please recall that this is the first time our branch has been able to offer 4 scholarships, the fourth one being made possible by an anonymous branch member. This means we are awarding a total of \$18,000 this year with 4, \$4500 scholarships. WOW!! The quality of the candidates' credentials is quite high, thus the gnashing of teeth mentioned above.

The Scholarship Committee is eager to introduce these outstanding recipients at the scholarship luncheon on May 18, 2024. You will have the opportunity to meet the recipients and their guests as well as to hear each of them speak. We hope to see you on May 18th!
