





Hey AAUW Members-do you have a family recipe or even recipe LOVE that you'd like to share? Or better yet, do you have your own creative recipe that "hands down" has family members literally, "kicking and screaming" asking you, "How do you make that?" or fighting for the last piece? Here is your chance to share with your AAUW Sisters!

And now to kick-off the holiday season, here is my Kentucky Pound Cake recipe! I got this years ago, don't remember from where, but totally awesome and... I only use Jim Beam Bourbon ©

Kentucky Pound Cake

- Flour: 3 cups all-purpose flour (or cake flour)
- Sugar: 1 ½ cups granulated sugar and ½ cup packed light brown sugar
- Butter: 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- Eggs: 4 large eggs, room temperature
- Buttermilk: 1 cup buttermilk, room temperature
- Jim Beam Bourbon: 1/4 cup bourbon for the cake batter
- Baking Powder: 1 tsp baking powder
- Baking Soda: ½ tsp baking soda
- Salt:1 tsp salt
- Vanilla Extract: 1-2 tsp

Bourbon Glaze Ingredients

- Butter: 6 Tbsp unsalted butter
- Sugar: ³/₄ cup granulated sugar
- Jim Beam Bourbon: ¹/₄ cup bourbon
- Water/Milk: 2-3 Tbsp water or a small amount of milk
- Vanilla: 1 tsp vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 325°F (163°C). Generously grease and flour a 10inch Bundt or tube pan.

Mix dry ingredients: In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt.



Mix wet ingredients: In a large bowl, cream the softened butter and both sugars until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, followed by the vanilla extract.

Combine: In a small bowl or measuring cup, combine the buttermilk and the ¼ cup of Jim

Beam bourbon. Gradually add the flour mixture to the creamed butter mixture, alternating with the buttermilk-bourbon mixture, beginning and ending with the flour mixture. Mix until just combined.

Bake: Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 55-70 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean.


Make Glaze: While the cake is baking, combine the glaze ingredients in a small saucepan over low heat just until the butter melts and the sugar dissolves. Do not boil.


Glaze the warm cake: Remove the cake from the oven and let it cool in the pan for about 10-15 minutes. Poke holes all over the top with a skewer. Slowly pour about three-quarters of the warm glaze over the cake, allowing it to soak in.

Cool and Serve: Invert the cake onto a serving plate. Brush the remaining glaze over the top and sides. Allow the cake to cool completely before slicing.




Purpose of the AAUW
